7:45 AM Depart on bus for Winston-Salem

9:00 AM Visit South Eastern Center for Contemporary Arts (SECCA) currently has a very interesting exhibit that should appeal to student interests: Show Name: [North Carolina New Contemporary]

Elements of the show include: A recent movement in art-making is fusing seemingly disparate elements of history painting and collage with graffiti, video gaming, folk, anime, advertising and film. In a state of continual mutation, this movement congregates a variety of practices in its ongoing attempts at mapping the history of the 21st century. From across the state of North Carolina, this exhibition will celebrate a generation of young artists redefining the visual identity of NC.

11:00 AM Eat lunch at Mellow Mushroom-downtown Winston-Salem. This is a popular pizza place.

12:00 PM Listen to a Hand Bell Choir Concert- 1st Presbyterian Church. Your child will get caught up in the holiday season by listening to the annual holiday concert in the church sanctuary. This church is cathedral style and features incredible stained glass as well as festive decorations for the holiday season. A very special treat offered only once a year to the general public.

1:30 PM Visit Third Eye Studios. We will walk from the church, 3 blocks to the studio, home and gardens of Mrs. Jan Detter. Jan is a professor at Wake Forest University, her home is nestled into the downtown portion of old Winston. She will open her home and studio to share with us her mosaic artwork and works in process. Her mosaic work is known across the world, as is the message found within her love of the artistic experience, nature and education.

3:00 PM Visit Reynolda House Museum of American Art. Here we will have the wonderful experience of seeing many works by Fredrick Church, Albert Bierstadt and Thomas Cole, who were early American artist which influenced the creation of the National Parks Service, Land Preservation Societies and our own conservation of natural resources and scenic places. There is also an exhibit of Dutch prints on display and we will take a guided tour of the entire house.

5:45 PM Return to school

These students also must be passing all their other courses, per school policy and get their other teachers to sign a grade verification form. Students must get their parents to fill out the attached permission form, front and back and sign in both places to attend this trip.
